



Admission Policy

Enrollment of children in Golden Hills Christian School is a privilege, not a right. Parents must understand that new enrollment, continued enrollment, and re-enrollment of their children are dependent upon their support of the school, its staff, and its policies. Each student is enrolled for a period of one year. The previous year's account must be current to reenroll. All forms and fees must be completed before a student is admitted.

Determining Factors for Admission:

- At least one parent must be a professing Christian who is actively involved and is in regular attendance at a Bible-believing church and agrees to our Statement of Faith.
- The family must be able and willing to meet financial obligations to the school.
- The family must show consistent efforts in the home to establish Christ as Lord of the family.
- The family must be able and willing to contribute time and energy to participating in their child(ren)'s education at home as well as at school.
- Student(s) must have a record of satisfactory academic performance and appropriate school behavior in the school previously attended.
- Kindergarten students must turn five by December 1, and meet the readiness standards. Please verify your child's age with a copy of his/her birth certificate.
- Academic readiness for grades 1-8 based on placement testing, most recent report card, and standardized testing.
- Applications will not be processed until all information has been received.

**A letter of admission or non-acceptance will be mailed to the parents.
Payment of the registration fee completes the enrollment process.**
